Volunteers are needed to create and provide hygiene care kits as *Remote Volunteers*. The hygiene care kits you make and donate will be distributed to our food distribution and shelter clients. We currently have 60 people living in our shelters, and about 1,000 households visiting our four food banks in a week. Thank you so much for your help!

GENERAL INSTUCTIONS:

Collect Items

You can be a bit creative with the items that you use, however keep in mind that these kits may be carried around everywhere and thus should not be too heavy. Items that are perfect for these care bags are listed below, but you can be creative and choose what you want to include:

- Water bottle
- Socks & beanie caps
- Tuna (pop top canned meat) and crackers
- Granola bar or cereal bar
- Fruit snack or applesauce cup
- Crackers with peanut butter or cheese
- Gift certificate to fast food
- Hand wipes and hand sanitizer
- Lotion

- Band Aids
- Chapstick
- Sunscreen, sun hat, sunglasses
- Comb or small brush
- Shampoo/conditioner
- Pack of facial tissues
- Maxi pads/tampons
- Toothbrush and toothpaste
- Can opener
- Mints, cough drops or gum

Create Bags

Now you are ready to assemble! We recommend placing the items in a large Ziploc bag, cinch sack or small backpack for easy carrying.

DROP OFF INSTRUCTIONS:

Once the care kits have been completed you are ready to drop them off. If you have a lot of kits, like a trunk or carload, please let Ann Stoddard (<u>astoddard@pohoc.org</u>) know when you want to deliver them so we can be ready.
